

ABOUT VISION 2020

Campaign Goal: \$10 million

Four funding initiatives have been established for the *Vision 2020* capital campaign in order to enable Point University to achieve its vision for the future:

1. Scholarships

Our goal is to raise \$3 million in scholarships that will allow us to provide higher education opportunities to more underserved, underprivileged and marginalized students each year. Scholarships enable the university to assist underprivileged students and families — many of whom could not afford a college education without financial assistance — while also giving us the ability to bring students with great potential to Point.

Funding Goal: \$3 million

2. Point 2020

Point 2020 is the strategic plan that aims to tactically establish the long-term success and stability of the University. As federal and state policies regarding student financial aid continue to change, it is more important than ever that Point University becomes more fiscally independent and self-sustainable. The goal of the Point 2020 plan — and this specific initiative of the Vision 2020 capital campaign — is to make this possible through strategic partnerships, expanded degree programs, increased recruitment and retention, and the centralization of traditional student activity in West Point through the construction and operation of a local residence hall and related student life support needs.

Funding Goal: \$3 million

3. Worship Center

Our goal is to construct a 1,200-seat facility in downtown West Point that will serve as a space for student chapel services, conferences, graduations, concerts and community gatherings on our main campus.

This facility will enable Point to create dynamic and in-demand chapel experiences where students can meet and be equipped with relevant and biblical teachings in a corporate worship setting. In addition to the worship center's use during the academic year, it will also have the ability to serve as a multifunctional space for hosting local, regional and state conferences and events, further allowing for the University's self-sustainability with an additional revenue source.

Funding Goal: \$2.5 million

4. Fine Arts Annex

The final funding initiative is the renovation of an existing structure and purchase of adjacent land, in order to support the growth of the Marching Skyhawks.

In fall 2015, the University introduced its first marching band. The program has grown quickly and is in need of practice and storage space suited to the specific needs of a marching band. The University has plans to renovate an existing facility in downtown West Point. This space will also be shared with other related programs.

Funding Goal: \$1.5 million
