- Identify and implement strategies to increase new donors, small gifts, and electronic giving.
- Collaborate with the Vice President of Advancement to develop and implement the university's financial strategy.
- Prepare foundation and grant proposals in support of capital campaigns.

- Five years of experience in fundraising.
