FACULTY AND STAFF TO RETURN TO WEST POINT CAMPUS ON JUNE 1

After much evaluation and planning, we are looking forward to welcoming staff back to our West Point campus and Peachtree City site on Monday, June 1.

Employees whose physical presence is essential, as determined by each area's chief officer, are expected to return at this time. Employees can also voluntarily return after receiving approval.

Point is offering this option now that we feel we can provide and enforce appropriate social distancing measures. All employees will need to comply with

University expectations of wearing a mask, washing their hands, staying home when sick, refraining from group gatherings and not inviting guests to campus.

As our staff returns to campus, Point is implementing new traffic flow restrictions in each building, as well as specified entry and exit points.

Additionally, we continue to provide regular cleaning to all areas.
